

STUDENTS FEEDBACK FORM ANALYSIS




We collected responses from our STUDENTS. Out of all responses collected, 43.3% are B.Com students, 17.8% are B.A. students and 38.9% are BMS students.


1) The office staff in the college is cooperative and helpful? 90 responses


2) How will you rate the University library facility available for the students? 90 responses

3) Separate common room is available for students?



36.7% alumni have said the common room is not available for students. 30% are unsure about the availability of a common room. 33.3% have said there is a common room for students.




5) The classrooms are clean and well maintained 90 responses



6) Clean drinking water is available in the college campus? 90 responses






8) The functioning of the placement cell in the college is satisfactory 90 responses


9) Continuous efforts are taken by the college to improve the quality of teaching and learning 90 responses




11) The mentoring process of the college helped me to identify my strengths and face challenges. 90 responses



A vast majority of 73.3% students said that the portion was completed on time. The remaining 26.7% students said the portion was not completed on time.


13) Modern teaching aids, PowerPoint presentations, web-resources, multi-media, e-content, etc. are used by most of the teachers while teaching 90 responses




15) The assessment and evaluation process is fair and unbiased 90 responses


16) The teachers take efforts to enhance employability skills in the students 90 responses

17) The teachers encourage the students to participate in extra-curricular, co-curricular activities, and research projects.




18) The teachers encourage the students to use reference books, e-resources, e-journals, etc 90 responses



While 8.9% students said teachers did not keep the students updated about the latest developments in the subject/area of knowledge


Parent Feedback form Analysis

4) Name of the department






The pupils of these parents can be broadly divided in two courses, with BA garnering 37.5% of the responses, while BMS leads with 62.5% of the responses.

6) Admission Procedure:





8) Work Culture observed by you and your ward:



9) Canteen Facility:



10) Library:24 responses





12) Sports and Cultural activities:



13) Students Counselling activities:




15) Use of Information and Communication Technology in the College: 24 responses



17) Improvement in Soft Skills, Knowledge, Ethics, Morality, observed by you in your ward while studying in college:





19) Evaluation and Feedback Mechanism:










The response trend shows that 71% B.A. students have responded to the form. Followed by BMS, Bcom, BVA and BSC-IT students.




As seen in the graph, out of 31 responses received, the majority of students have graduated in the year 2022-23.






Students have received jobs through various resources and forums other than campus placement.



Syllabus is suitable to the course.







Aims and objectives of the syllabi are well defined and clear to teachers and students. 30 responses




- **Responses**: Teachers generally agreed that the aims and objectives of the syllabus are clear to both faculty and students.




The course/syllabus has good balance between theory and application 30 responses


Tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus. 30 responses

I have the freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies of teaching (such as seminar presentations, group discussions and learners' participations) and of testing and assessment of students.



Infrastructural facilities, such as staffrooms, class rooms, reading room and toilets are available in the Institute.




Rate the support/resource provided byinstitute for your development?[like FDP,Workshop, Books, Conferences etc.]


- **Responses**: Ratings on support resources such as workshops, conferences, and FDPs (Faculty Development Programs) ranged from "Good" to "Excellent."
